The route to the national title will be single-elimination, with two consolation matches being played for 3rd, 5th, 7th, and 9th places.

Post-Championship Awards: The awards ceremony will be conducted at center court immediately following the conclusion of the championship match. The following will be presented following the championship match: 2 team trophies (national champion and runner-up), 20 gold medals to each individual player on the National Championship team, championship caps to each player on the National Championship Team, 20 silver medals to each individual player on the National Runner-Up team, the Dorothy L. Brown Most Valuable Player Award, the Heidi Cartisser Coach of the Tournament Award, 12 medals to each player on the All-Tournament Team, and the Team Sportsmanship Award to one team that participated in the DI Volleyball National Tournament.

Last time out: The 2022 NJCAA DI Volleyball Championship was held in West Plains, MO for 12th time in NJCAA DI Volleyball history. Florida SouthWestern won their first National Championship title in volleyball program history after defeating Miami Dade in four sets (25-16, 12-25, 25-20, 25-16). Championship Titles: NJCAA Volleyball was comprised of a single division from 1974-1996. Division I Volleyball began in 1997, with Southern Idaho winning the inaugeral national championship. The most national championships have been won by College of Southern Idaho with 12 (1993, 1994, 1995, 1996, 1997, 1998, 2000, 2005, 2009, 2012, 2015, 2018). The most national tournament appearances have been by Barton (24), Miami Dade (22), Southern Idaho (21), Iowa Western (20), Wallace State (19), Western Nebraska (19), and Illinois Central, Jefferson, and Miami Dade-South who all have made 18 appearances in the tournament.




ABOUT THE NJCAA

HEAD COACH: In her first four seasons as Head Coach of the Bucs, FSW has put together a 88-23 overall record and a 40-3 mark in Suncoast Conference play, leading to three Conference Championships, a State Championship, and three Top 10 finishes at the NJCAA National Tournament. Baziquetto-Allen has also put together a proven track record of sending players onto the next level with 14 players moving onto the Division I level in her first three recruiting cycles and 21 players overall continuing their careers at the four year level.

In 2022, Baziquetto-Allen led FSW to their first NJCAA National Championship in just it's fourth season as a program. Baziquetto-Allen was named the NJCAA and AVCA National Coach of the Year, leading the Bucs to a 27-1 overall record. FSW posted a 13-1 mark in Suncoast Conference play to win it's third straight Conference Championship as well as blowing through the competition at the FCSAA State Tournament to win it's first Championship in program history there as well. The Bucs entered the NJCAA National Tournament as the top overall seed and defended that spot, dropping just one set in their four matches in West Plains, FSW defeated in-state rival Miami Dade 3-1 in the Championship Game to claim their first Title. The Bucs had two All-Americans for the third straight year including Barbara Koehler who was named the NJCAA and AVCA National Player of the Year. Baziquetto-Allen came to FSW after spending three seasons as the head coach at Seward County CC in Liberal, Kansas. In her three years as the head coach with the Lady Saints, Baziquetto-Allen amassed an overall record of 86-28 (.754), while going 43-5 (.896) in Jayhawk West play.

HEAD COACH: Under Coach Chrisman in 2022, the Plainswomen made their fifth consecutive National Appearance after winning the Northwest Plains District Championship. NJC Plainswomen finished tied for 13th at the National Tournament and had a 25-15 record. Northeastern had 4 All Region Players, the Region Libero of the Year, and three All-Tournament Players. Coach Chrisman was named Northwest Plains District B Coach of the Year.

Mackenzie Chrisman came to Northeastern in the spring of 2019 and was named the head coach in the spring of 2020. She is a native of Sterling, Colo., and attended Sterling High School where she competed in three sports: volleyball, basketball, and track. Throughout her high school career, she received seven all-conference awards and two all-state awards. Upon graduating from Sterling, she continued her volleyball career at Chadron State College. While there she was a top-three scorer and led the team in blocks. After two years, Chrisman transferred to the University of West Florida (UWF); a top-ranked NCAA Division II school. In her two years there, Chrisman helped her team reach their highest-ever national ranking of 10th in the AVCA poll in 2018, two Gulf South Conference Championships (GSC), and a bid into the NCAA D2 national tournament both her junior and senior years. In her senior year, she was again a topthree scorer for UWF. Being goal-oriented and passionate about blocking, she set out to and broke the UWF individual season blocking record with 141 blocks that was previously set in 2002. At the conclusion of her career, she was named to the 2018 GSC All-Tournament Team, First Team All-GSC Conference, and First Team D2CCA All-South Region recognition which led to a nomination for All-American honors. She also earned Fall All-GCS Academic honors and

HEAD COACH: The name Origenes "Kiko" Benoit has become synonymous with success in the world of women's college volleyball. In 17 years as MDC's coach, Benoit has led the Sharks to 14 state titles and two national championships. The Sharks have also finished second nationally five times during Benoit's tenure. Benoit has been named the Southern Conference Coach of the Year 13 times and State Coach of the Year 13 times. In 2005, 2009, 2014, 2017 and 2018, he was named AVCA Northeast/Southeast Region Coach of the Year. He was also named AVCA National Coach of the Year in 2017. Benoit has helped numerous former MDC players go on to excel at Division I universities as well as in professional volleyball all over Europe and Latin America. Prior to becoming MDC's head coach, he served 10 years as a Sharks assistant. During that span, MDC compiled a 441-85 record and won four national titles. The program also finished second a total of six times during that run. Benoit was selected as the AFLAC Southeastern Region Assistant Coach of the Year in 2002. In 2005, he took over as head coach, promptly winning a state title and leading the Sharks to another runner-up finish at the national championships. Benoit hasn't slowed down since, continuing to dedicate countless hours, both coaching on the floor as well as coordinating recruiting efforts for the Sharks. Benoit graduated from MDC and earned a Bachelor's of Science degree in General Education, with a minor in Psychology, from Columbia College (M Со

HEAD COACH: Apolinario and his Bulldogs enter the 2023 fall season with a three-year record of 65-27, three consecutive Region XIV Tournament appearances, one NJCAA national tournament qualification and a .707 winning percentage. His 2022 Bulldogs went 27-8, earned national ranking between Nos. 13 and 18 for seven of the NJCAA's 10 polling periods and gained the region's No. 2 seed for the postseason tournament.

Apolinario's 2022 Bulldogs, national Division I leaders in aces, earned five all-region honors, including Freshman of The Year Hanna Tylska, Kalina Pylinska, libero Lilouann Bechec, outside hitter Ana Beatriz Nunes Dos Santos, and setter Berfin Mertcan. Tylska led NJCAA D-I in four statistical categories (service aces, plus per-set totals for aces, kills and points), ranked second in two others (total kills and pomts) and seventh in yet another (total attacks).

At Rice University, Apolinario assisted as offensive coordinator and worked specifically with outside and right-side hitters. During that time, the Owls went 41-21, advanced to one C-USA Tournament Final, and to one National Invitational Tournament. Two years earlier at Ohio University, Apolinario was a defensive coordinator, with focus on setters and middle blockers. The Bobcats went 48-14, including a pair of Mid-American Conference (MAC) East regular-season and conference tournament championships, plus a berth in the 2015 NCAA Tournament. HEAD COACH: Head coach Lyndsey Michel enters the 2023 campaign following a record-breaking season last year. 2023 marks Michel's 12th season at the helm of the Warrior program. In a year that saw the Warriors make a run to the Final Four of the NJCAA National Tournament, Michel became the all-time winningest coach in school history during the 2022 season. In 11 seasons with the Warriors, Michel owns a 309-113 (.732) record, an average of 28.1 wins per season. Michel has won 30 games or more on six separate occasions at Indian Hills, including 42 victories in 2022, the program's second-most wins in a season in school history. The Warriors captured the National Junior College Athletic Association (NJCAA) DI Midwest District Championship in 2022 as Michel brought the Warriors back to the national tournament for the second time in four years. The Warriors also claimed the outright ICCAC Regular Season Championship in 2022, the program's first outright championship since 2004. The Warriors previously earned a shared regular season title three times - 2015, 2016, and 2019.

Michel has coached six NJCAA All-Americans and a total of 25 NJCAA All-Region XI selections. 25 individual student-athletes have also earned prestigious NJCAA All-Academic selections during Michel's tenure in Ottumwa. 2022 re-wrote the record books for the Indian Hills Volleyball program as Michel guided the Warriors to a 42 wins, the program's highest national ranking in school history, two NJCAA All-Americans, and six individual and team school records. After starting the season ranked No. 19 in the preseason polls, the Warriors climbed to No. 2 in the nation in five separate NJCAA polls and found themselves in the national rankings every week of the year. The Warriors posted an undefeated record in conference play and captured the 2022 NJCAA Midwest District with a pair of straight-set sweeps. Michel led the Warriors to two victories at the national tournament and a fourth-place showing, the program's second-best finish at the national tournament.

Sophomore libero Ruxandra Flueras was named to the KJCCC West first team, sophomore Maelie Chupin was All-KJCCC Second Team, and sophomore Alessia Bergessio was Honorable Mention. As her teams have done for years, Jones's 2022-23 Trojans excelled in the classroom, finishing third nationally with a 3.87 GPA team GPA. They were also recognized as a United States Marine Corps (USMC)/American Volleyball Coaches Association (AVCA) Academic Team. Additionally, they made the AVCA Honor Roll reserved for teams with GPAs in the top 20% of two-year colleges. Another highlight from last season came when five sophomores signed letters of intent to attend a university.

Before moving to Colby, Jones was the head volleyball coach at Andale High School in 2008. She spent the 2006 season as an assistant coach at Garden City Community College. Jones attended Cottey College in Nevada, Mo., where she was a two-sport athlete playing basketball and volleyball. She transferred to the University of Saint Mary in Leavenworth, Kan., to play volleyball and study sports management and marketing. She was also involved in coaching volleyball at the club level throughout college.
